Have a pre-reading meeting with our team



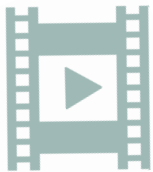
Hear your play read by actors and discussed by industry peers

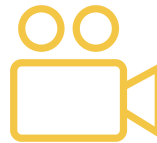
